The Children's Rights Council in the United States ("CRC"), as Sponsor, invites participation internationally in Equal Parents' Week ("EPW"). This year, EPW takes place September 22 through September 28, 2003. Participation in EPW is achieved by wearing purple ribbons and tying them everywhere they can be seen in public. The objective of Equal Parents' Week is to publicly send the message that parental rights and responsibilities must be shared equally by unmarried parents.

DIR. OF INFORMATION SERVICES: EPW advocates that equality is not just a legal concept. EPW is a civil rights movement and a human rights movement. The right of both parents to function as a parent, the right of children to be raised and nurtured by both parents, and the right of families to exist and function as a family, are rights inherent and inalienable to all families. The request for equal parent status is a mandate for the time it takes to love, nurture, and teach our children our values the only way we can ... a mandate for the ability to be a parent...and a mandate for justice. The CRC is soliciting participation of organizations internationally who believe that "the best parent is both parents" to unite the voices of people throughout the world to bring attention to family law issues affecting parents, children and family members.

> IMPORTANT NOTE: As an international event we are observing "A Moment in our Hearts, A Moment of Solidarity," by holding as many candlelight vigils as possible throughout the world. All candlelight vigils will be held on the same date & time: Thursday, Sept. 25, 2003 at 7:30 p.m. We are urging all people who cannot attend a candlelight vigil or who do not have one taking place near them to holding their own "Home Vigil" by lighting a candle in their home for at least 15 minutes, on Sept. 25, 2003 at 7:30 p.m. A "Home Vigil" can be held by anyone, by a single person living alone, and include as many people as you wish, so family and friends can be invited. Home vigils are as important as public candlelight vigils, as they are very valuable in strengthening the message of EPW.

EPW advocates that a 2-parent focus be established as an international priority, maximizing the involvement that both parents are willing and able to contribute in raising their children, and promoting the ability of both parents to meet all their children's needs without compromising or imposing financial impediments to nonfinancial forms of child support. The CRC's campaign, JUST SAY YES! to Joint Custody advocates that parents exercise their first responsibility as a parent...to "just say yes" to unconditionally loving and sacrificing for their children...and that means, "Just Say Yes!" to joint custody.
